



How to configure ThunderBird for YahooMail

You will need to set your Yahoo account generate a special password for Thunderbird to sign-in. To do this, you will need to sign in to your Yahoo Mail by going to https://mail.yahoo.com.

Once logged in, click on your name on the upper right corner of the web page. Next, click on the **Account Info** link




At the Personal Info page, click on **Account Security**




At the Accounts Security page, scroll down to the bottom and click on "Generate app password".



Account Security




An <u>App passwords</u> window will appear. Select <u>Other App</u> then click on <u>Generate</u>




At the **Enter custom name**, type in Thunderbird, then click on **Generate**






A random password will be generated. Copy that password on to a notepad or a piece of paper. Click on **Done** to finish



How to use this app password


- 1. Go to the settings section of your app
- 2. Find the screen where you enter your Yahoo account username and password
- 3. Copy the app password above and paste it into the password field



We can now move on to configuring **Mozilla ThunderBird** to work with your Yahoo Mail.

Once you have ThunderBird install and you launch it for the first time, you will get this welcome message. You just select "Skip this and use my existing email".






Next you will get the account setup window. Enter your Name, Yahoo email address and the password you generated from Yahoo earlier. Then click on **Continue** .

Note: If you don't want to have to enter your password every time you launch ThunderBird, put a check on the Remember password tick box





After ThunderBird completes checking online for the necessary settings, you will get the message below. You just need to click on **Done** and your email should start downloading into your ThunderBird.
